The bibliographical apparatus has become increasingly difficult to use as library and information technology has grown more sophisticated. Knowledge transfer is the sharing or dissemination of knowledge and the provision of inputs to problem solving. In organizational theory, knowledge transfer is the practical problem of transferring knowledge from one part of the organization to another. Like knowledge management, knowledge transfer seeks to organize, create, capture, or distribute knowledge and ensure its availability for future users. It is considered to be more than just a communication problem. If it were merely that, then a memorandum, an e-mail or a meeting would accomplish the knowledge transfer. Knowledge transfer is more complex because:

Knowledge resides in organizational members, tools, tasks, and their subnetworks and much knowledge in organizations is tacit or hard to articulate.

The subject has been taken up under the title of knowledge management since the 1990s. The term has also been applied to the transfer of knowledge at the international level. In business, knowledge transfer, has now become a common topic in mergers and acquisitions. It focuses on transferring technological platforms, market experience, managerial expertise, corporate culture, and other intellectual capital that can improve companies' competence. Since technical skills and knowledge are very important assets for firms' competence in the global competition, unsuccessful knowledge transfer can have a negative impact on corporations and lead to the expensive and time-consuming mergers and acquisitions not creating values to the firms.
