

Let's talk: The City of London

Eric: Hello and welcome to this week's edition of "Let's talk", the discussion programme with our commentators Tom and Marie.

Marie: Good evening everyone.

Tom: Good evening.

Eric: Tom you went to London last week, didn't you? You told me you had a meeting with an important businessman. **Tom**: Yes, I did! I interviewed the chief executive of a major UK financial group. He works in the City.

Marie: So you visited the heart of international high finance, interesting.

Tom: Yes, it was interesting actually. You know, the City is very small but very important in the world of finance. I mean, did you know that the City of London, that's its full name, is just one square mile or 2.6 kilometres? And that only 7,000 people live there?

Eric: Really? So few people?

Tom: Yes, only 7,000 people live there but more than 320,000 people a day commute into the City to work there.

Eric: Wow, a third of a million commuters every day. Can we explain to our viewers just why this part of London is so important?

Tom: Of course! The City is a global financial centre with hundreds of banks, financial exchanges, insurance companies and investment companies. You know there are more than 500 companies in the City.

Marie: That's right! And it also has several important commodity markets. The City's the place to buy commodities such as oil, gold and silver. In the City people carry out all kinds of financial transactions, they borrow money, save money, invest money, buy and sell commodities, buy and sell insurance for all kinds of things, from oil tankers to skyscrapers!

Tom: Exactly Marie! Together with Tokyo and New York the City is one of the world's most important financial centres. It's situated between the time zones of Asia and America. In fact, offices in the City don't have just one clock, they have at least four, with clocks showing the time for Tokyo, Zurich and New York.

Eric: So the City's open for business 24 hours a day! Well, do only people from the world of finance work there? **Tom**: No, no! Lots of other highly skilled people work there. For example many lawyers, accountants and computer experts work there. They help the banks and insurance companies to work smoothly.

Marie: It's worth remembering too that the City's a beautiful place to visit. It can be ultra-modern and medieval at the same time. There are some beautiful old buildings, especially the churches, and some innovative new buildings such as the Lloyd's insurance building and the Swiss Re Building, or the "gherkin" as it's now known.

Tom: But remember: don't visit the City at weekends! There's nobody there! And most of the shops and pubs are closed.

Eric: Thanks for that tip! Well, the City's the financial heart of the UK and perhaps of Europe. But it is also an interesting place to visit with many interesting buildings. Thanks to our commentators.

Marie: Goodbye.
Tom: Goodbye.

Eric: Goodbye everyone and see you again soon for a next interesting appointment with "Let's talk".

ENGLISH TODAY TV PROGRAMMES: LET'S TALK

Let's talk: Migration

Eric: Good evening to all viewers and welcome to this week's edition of "Let's talk", our discussion programme with our expert commentators Tom and Marie.

Marie: Good evening Eric.

Tom: Good evening.

Eric: Well, according to the data from the latest European conference on migration the number of migrants arriving in Europe has increased enormously over the last five years. EU politicians are divided on this issue. Some of them believe that migration is a bad thing and causes lots of problems. On the other hand, other politicians maintain that migrants contribute to the developing of the economy. Could I ask what you think about this issues?

Marie: Well, in my opinion migrants don't help our economy. On the contrary they take jobs from local people and push down pay rates for both unskilled and skilled workers. In fact migrants are often paid less than the legal minimum wage.

Tom: I'm afraid I don't agree with you Marie. Many employers use immigration to plug labour shortages, for example in agriculture. Farmers employ thousands of Eastern European workers to pick their crops as they can't find local workers to do the work.

Eric: That's true. In addition there are low birth rates in most European countries, particularly in Spain and Italy. The economies of these countries need more workers, especially for difficult jobs that local people don't want to do.

Tom: Exactly! And it's important to remember that migrant workers contribute to the economy because they pay taxes.

Eric: Well, this only happens if migrants work legally! Unfortunately many migrants come into Europe illegally. Marie: You're right Eric! They come in illegally and they often form an underclass that doesn't have access to healthcare and education. That's why they sometimes get involved in criminal activities. I think some immigration is ok, especially if the immigrants are asylum seekers or refugees who can't return to their home countries. Apart from this I think European governments should put a stop to immigration.

Eric: How do you suggest they do this?

Marie: Well, the EU should do more to help develop the economies of North and West Africa. This would help economic migrants, migrants who come to Europe to work, to stay at home, find a job and develop their local economies.

Tom: Come on Marie, today the world's a "global village". People have always moved around the world. Don't forget for example the millions of Europeans who migrated to North America at the beginning of the last century. They experienced the same problems that the Africans are experiencing today.

Eric: That's right Tom! Migration is as old as the human race. People have always moved to where it's possible to make a living. Maybe we should get used to the idea that our society is becoming more and more multiracial. Ok, this
